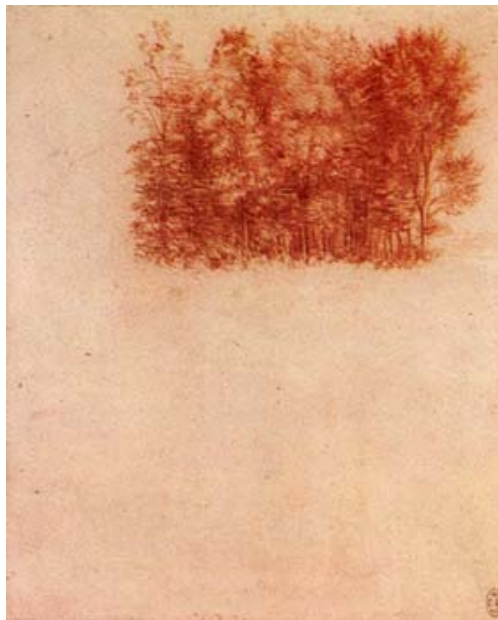


Leonardo da Vinci said:
